If you have a home or business with sidewalks- make sure to shovel them within 24 hours after the snow falls.

Remove all vehicles from the streets until the plows have been out and the streets are cleared of snow. Cars shouldn't be parked on streets during snow storms as they are a hazard to plow drivers and it can not be properly cleaned from the
